Master of Science in Nurse Anesthesia

History

The School of Nursing originated as a diploma program at Our Lady of the Lake Hospital in 1923. In 1990, Our Lady of the Lake College was established based on the recommendation of the nursing faculty. The diploma program was transitioned to an Associate of Science in Nursing program. The first class was admitted in 1990. The nurse anesthesia program was initiated in 2005 to provide the opportunity for baccalaureate prepared registered nurses to complete a Master of Science in Nurse Anesthesia. The program admitted its first class in August 2005.

Purpose

The purpose of the nurse anesthesia program is to prepare the registered nurse for advanced clinical practice in the field of anesthesia as a certified registered nurse anesthetist. The graduates of this program receive a Master of Science in Nurse Anesthesia. Upon successful completion, the student will be eligible to sit for the national certification examination offered by the Council on Certification for Nurse Anesthetists (CCNA).

Enrollment

Applicants to the Master of Science in Nurse Anesthesia program must complete an application specific to the program. Applications are due on or before November 1st for the August class. Enrollment is limited and admission is via a competitive selection process.

Length of Program

The program is a 28 month continuous program with no semester breaks. There is no provision for part-time study.

Graduation Rate/Certification Pass Rate/Employment Outlook

Through the graduating class of 2010, the graduation rate since program inception is 88%.

All graduates from Our Lady of the Lake College nurse anesthesia program have successfully passed the Council on Certification of Nurse Anesthetists' Certification Examination and have earned the title of Certified Registered Nurse Anesthetist (CRNA). Through the Graduating Class of 2010, 99 students have graduated from the program. Of those 99 graduates, 96 (approximately 97%) of them passed the exam on their first attempt. The remaining 3 students (3%) passed on the second attempt.

Transferability

Transfer credit for graduate courses from other institutions will be accepted according to college policy. Students may be allowed to transfer up to three credit hours of graduate level statistics to be used toward the Master of Science in Nurse Anesthesia degree.

Admission Requirements

Applicants should fulfill the following criteria to be considered for admission:

1. Current, unrestricted licensure as a registered nurse (RN).
2. Graduate of an accredited school of nursing at the RN level.
3. Baccalaureate degree in nursing from an accredited college or university.
4. Minimum of 1-year at full-time (2 years preferred) recent experiences as a RN in an adult critical care setting;
5. Academic preparedness for advanced sciences and clinical skills.
6. Graduate Record Examination (GRE) within last 5 years. An official copy must be submitted. A formula score determined by using a sliding scale between GRE and grade point average (GPA) is used and the applicant must meet minimum entrance requirements.
7. Completion of application requirements as stated in the application instructions.
8. Cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher.
9. Application completed by advertised deadline.
10. Current BLS and ACLS certification.
11. CCRN recognition is encouraged; CCRN is required if applicant re-applies to the program.
12. One undergraduate or graduate chemistry course.

Students accepted to the CRNA Program must be licensed as a registered nurse in Louisiana.

Curriculum Plan

Students seeking the Master of Science in Nurse Anesthesia must complete the 80 credit hours in the curriculum. The responsibility of the program is to offer a comprehensive didactic and clinical curriculum in the field of nurse anesthesia. Classroom work provides a knowledge base for advanced pharmacology, anatomy, physiology, pathophysiology, and principles of nurse anesthesia. Clinical work is extensive and prepares the nurse to provide anesthesia services for various patient populations.
