

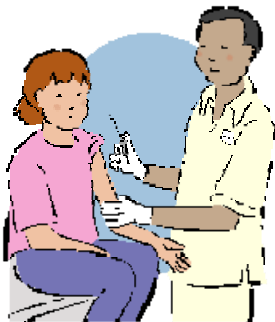


Are Your Vaccines Up-to Date?

Louisiana legislation mandates that students entering post-secondary schools show proof of measles, mumps, rubella, diphtheria and tetanus

AND for those students entering college for the first time after July 2006... meningitis. If you have not submitted proof of these vaccines to the College, a "hold" will be placed on your student account. A hold will prevent you from getting your transcripts, registering for the next semester, and complicate any business transactions with the College. So get your documentation in now.

HeaRTS

Helps Fill a Healthcare Need

Abbeville, LA. July 15, 2007 – The HeaRTS (Healthcare Recovery Training System) program kicked off today at Abbeville General Hospital. The program is an initiative of the Southwest Louisiana Area Healthcare Education Center (SWLAHEC) that will train and place nearly 1,000 healthcare professionals in hurricane affected parishes.

Southern Louisiana parishes are experiencing a massive shortage of healthcare workers because of hurricanes Katrina and Rita. To help alleviate this problem, HeaRTS is offering training programs in CAN, LPN, Surgical Technician, Echo Technician, RN, and PCT. Eligible applicants can receive free tuition, support services and workforce placement in one of 20 hurricane- affected parishes.

"We want to do everything possible to remove the barriers that adults face when going back to school or re-entering the workforce," said Bootsie Durand the Director of Career Recruitment and Professional Education. "That is why we are assisting with childcare, transportation, supplies, and more to ensure those in need have an equal opportunity to receive this education."

"Healthcare Institutions across the country struggle with recruitment of trained professionals- the need is even greater at a rural facility and those with workforce shortages due to the aftermath of hurricanes Katrina and Rita" said Denise Noel, RN, BSN, Director of Patient Care Services at Abbeville General. "These training programs are invaluable to us."

Training sessions are offered in various locations throughout Southern Louisiana including many of the Louisiana Technical Colleges including Abbeville, Lafayette, Morgan City, and New Iberia campuses. The classes can last anywhere from six weeks for CNA certification to as long as two years for Surgical Tech certification.

The HeaRTS program is funded at six million dollars through a Community Development Block Grant Program known as the Recovery Workforce Training Program (RWTP). The RWTP was established by the Louisiana Recovery Authority, in collaboration with the State Office of Community Development's Disaster Recovery Unit and the Louisiana Workforce Commission.

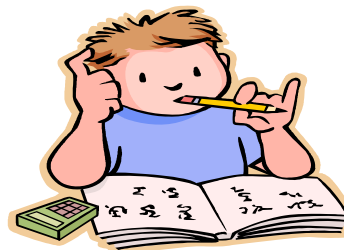

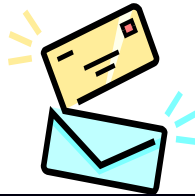
Response to “\$50.00 Registration Fee and the Add/Drop Process”

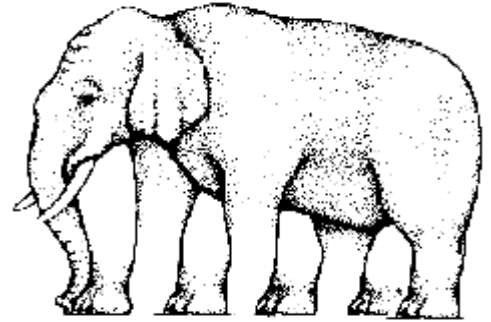
Sudoku Challenge

How to Play:

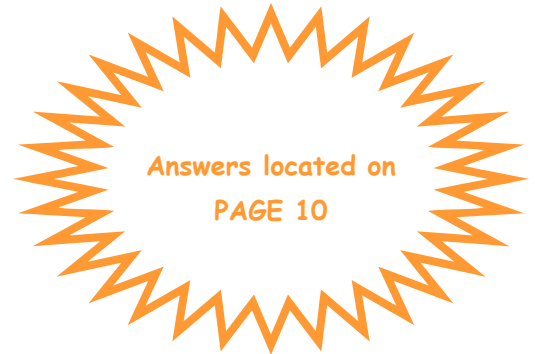
